# ASSIGNMENT OF CASES

- CIS Software suggests the assignment
- Final power to assign is with Chief Judge
- Data & Files registered and transferred
- Assignee Court is notified about case
- Remaining fields are filled by Court Clerk
- Information is updated in Server

# PREPERATION OF E-FILES

- Paper Files are converted to E-Files
- All parts of files are book-marked
- E-Files are loaded on a central Server
- Server is connected to Courts' Computers
- Files are sent a day in advance to Courts
- Court Master can check the E-Files
- E-Files can be opened by Cause-List Links



# E-TRIAL OF CASES

- Judges have 24' Wacom Touch Screens
- Files are available in PDF Format
- Proper Bookmarking is done
- Judge can see any document in a second
- File can be controlled by Court Master
- One can scroll through Orders & pleadings
- Any new document is digitized in Court

# PAPERLESS E-COURTS

- Various High Courts and District Courts are creating E-Courts
- Judges are being trained for E-Courts
- There is no movement of files
- Many people can work on the same file
- No need to send trial court record to High Court, when appeal or revision is filed

- All Jails are connected to District Courts
- Undertrials waiting Charge-sheets are not brought to Courts for Remand extension
- They are produced before Magistrates through Video-Conferencing
- Govt. is saving lot of money otherwise spent on transportation & security

# VIDEO-CONFERENCING TRIALS

- Trials of all dreaded criminals are done through Video-Conferencing
- Forensic Experts and Doctors are also examined through Video-Conferencing
- Formal Police Witnesses are also examined
- Witnesses living far away & who can not come to court use Video-Conferencing

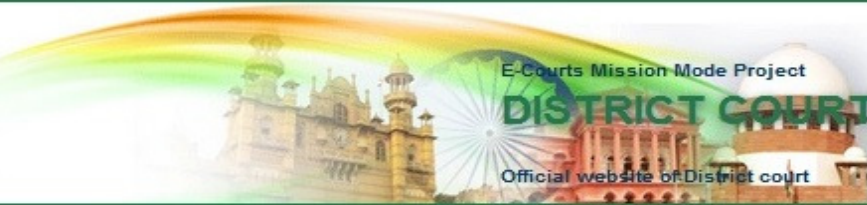

## History



town was originally known as Lodhiana, which means the town of Lodi's. The name later changed to the present name Ludhiana.

Ludhiana city was founded in the time of Lodhi dynasty which ruled in Delhi from 1451-1526 A.D. The legend goes that two Lodhi Chief Yusaf Khan and Nihand Khan were deputed by Sikandar Lodhi (1489-1517 A.D.) to restore order in this region. They camped at the site of present city of Ludhiana which was then a village called Mir Hota. Yusaf Khan went across the river Sutlej in Jalandhar Doab to check Khokhars who were plundering the Doab and made a settlement at Sultanpur while Nihand Khan stayed back and founded the present city at the site of village Mir Hota.
